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The Situation

Effective cybersecurity and the protection of personal (consumer and employees) and business information requires collaboration between IT/security, legal and compliance.

Establishing and maintaining effective crossfunctional collaboration between the GC, CCO and CISO can be a challenge

Reducing cybersecurity risk requires cascading controls to the departments that deal with third parties (supply chain procurement, sales, etc.) – and to the third parties

Cybersecurity has an impact

on fraud, business continuity, protection of consumer data/confidential information and **company reputation**

Regulatory pressures from industry regulations, GDPR and CCPA focused on data privacy **complicate the situation**
